PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

An extraordinary meeting of the Parish Council was held on the 14th. January. Present were Chairman John Hume, five councillors, clerk, district councillor and thirty seven members of the public.

Vacancy:

There is a vacancy for a parish councillor following the resignation of Mrs V. Partridge.

Minutes from previous meeting were confirmed and signed as correct.

Planning:

Babergh council have granted permission for alterations at Sampsons Hall.

Application for erection of two dwellings at Kersey Mill has been withdrawn.

Linton House: Plans were on view for application to build two bungalows in the garden of Linton House. A family representative gave a presentation on behalf of the applicants. It would be on a similar footprint to existing outbuildings which would be demolished. This proposal would provide much needed smaller accessible properties in the village replacing many which have been lost over the years when smaller cottages have been made into one. One bungalow would be for the applicants to live in the other would be sold. It was stated that Linton House would eventually be sold if application was successful.

The meeting was opened so members of the public could speak. The majority who spoke were against this proposal although they had every sympathy for the applicants who were long standing residents of the village. Some of the reasons being it was a special landscape area, loss of privacy, effect on surrounding listed properties and destroying the character of the village.

Councillors had been and visited the site and after discussion it was agreed not to support this application.

AOB: Concerns were raised about the number of HGVs which use a business on Cox Hill, Boxford They were causing problems at the junction in Boxford and it had been suggested that an alternative route could be via Wickerstreet Green. This road is narrow and difficult for vehicles to pass. Residents have been in touch with the County Councillor.

Sadly the red triangle on the top of the old school sign on Church Hill seems to have been stolen.

NEWS FROM KERSEY SCHOOL

Squirrels (Reception):

In Squirrels class we are looking at the topic people who help us, looking at jobs such as vets, policmen, firemen and doctors. We are looking what they need to do in their jobs and who they may help.

Hedgehogs (Years 1 and 2):

Hedgehogs class have been learning about the Ice Age and have had lots of fun with experimenting with ice and seeing which is the best way to melt it. We shall be learning about the pre-historic animals that lived during the Ice Age and writing our own fact files about the creatures, as well as making our own cave paintings.



Badgers (Years 3 and 4):

What a busy start to the term we have had in Badgers class. We have been really excited about starting our new topic 'The Romans.' It's great because it has a really strong link with our topic of 'Crime and Punishment' from last year. Our topic has also filtered through to maths this week, as we have been learning all about Roman Numerals. They have been tricky to learn but by using lots of code breaking activities we have got there! FARMING NOTES - January 2019

Arable:

Since last writing we have completed harvesting the sugar beet crop in reasonable conditions without too much disruption from mud on the road! Indeed, conditions have been so good that we have been able to plough all the land that was sugar beet and have sowed two of the fields with spring malting barley between January 8th and 12th. This is a full 2 months earlier than usual, and would not have been possible had we received the normal winter rainfall.

Sugar beet yields have been reasonable considering last summer's drought, and we have sent 1,960 tonnes of crop to Bury sugar beet factory. This represents 65 tonnes/hectare (26 tonnes/acre) and is about 18% less than our 5 year average due to the dry growing season.

The new lean-to has been satisfactorily completed and is currently full of machinery, allowing plenty of storage space for 180 tonnes of fertiliser, for the new growing season, in the other buildings.



Livestock:

The main ewe flock which totals just over 100 including last year's ewe lambs, spent most of November and December enjoying the two fields of stubble turnips which we grew near the Kersey play area. They have now moved back onto one of the grass fields where the open autumn has allowed the grass to keep growing.

The March lambing portion of the flock have been pregnancy scanned by a contractor using an ultrasound scanner: 6 ewes were empty and will be sold, 25 will have single lambs, 40 will have twins and 4 sets of triplets were predicted. The two Blue Texel ewes which were flushed for embryos produced 7 embryos which resulted in 7 pregnancies. The scanning information is useful as feeding and housing can be adjusted to suit the ewes. A different small group of 14 ewes

lambed over the New Year period producing some Pure Suffolk lambs, some of which we hope to show in the summer.

All of the cattle are housed and the cows have also been pregnancy scanned, 8 were found to be barren and 4 of those have been sold, the rest of the herd are in calf with single calves (which is normal) except for four which are pregnant with twins, these four have been separated and are being given extra rations. Calving is due to start in early February and should be completed by May.

A small autumn calving group of cows resulted in 5 calves being produced in December; one of these had a breech presentation and had to be delivered by caesarean, a necessary but costly operation.

Four more of our young British Blue bulls have been selected by Cogent and after thorough health tests and veterinary checks they are due to go to stud to produce semen which Cogent will sell for use to produce beefy calves. We have been and will be implanting more embryos in partnership with Cogent. More about this in a later issue.
