UPLANDS FARM

Hello, We are writing today as a brief introduction to our family farm at Kersey, named Uplands Farm.

We are the Sargeant family, and we moved into Swallows Rest, at Uplands Farm, last year at the tail end of January. Since taking over the running of the business, from Mr Sargeant, Senior, we have made steady progress on our plans for the future of the farm

One project that has evolved over the past year is the Farmstand. You may have seen it advertised on Facebook, as our Uplands Farm Produce page. We started last summer to sell sacks of potatoes alongside our daughter Lauren's heritage breed eggs, as her flock and subsequent egg production increased. As time went on people asked if we were going to stock other items, and now we have teamed up with local producers and suppliers to stock Jams, Chutneys and Honey, British grown seasonal Fruit and Vegetables, as well as our own farm sourced and dried firewood, and eco friendly tree mulch. In the summer watch out for our own home grown produce as well.

If you haven't visited us yet, the farmstand is an open air, self serve stand, however if we are able to, we will stop by and say hello and check you've got everything that you needed. We enjoy seeing people coming to the farm, it's lovely to have visitors albeit under covid safe circumstances, but hopefully in the near future will be able to show people the animals when they drop by if they would like to see them. The first week of home-schooling was not a success as Emily decided she had a lot of things to do and many toys which needed playing with. By the second week there was a plan...

Her parents decided she would wear her school uniform and her father would call a register of all the names he could remember of the children in her class. Then came the hand sanitising process and finally lining up outside the room where she was to work (with help and supervision from whichever adult was available). And it has worked! Today, we help those in need with their winter fuel bills, in a small way, and we also make donations to the local food bank in the hope this covers Kersey too. We are always looking for new ways to help each other and those with a genuine need.

To this end, we have managed to include Kersey in the existing **Hadleigh and Boxford Community Car Scheme** which has been running for some years and is organised by Jen Eastwood, a resident in Boxford.

If you are a patient, registered at Hadleigh Health Centre, Boxford Surgery, or Bildeston surgery in need of a lift to medical appointments including Doctors, Consultants, Physiotherapists, Opticians, Dentists etc. we will be happy to help. We have a number of volunteer drivers who are available to take you to your appointment, wait for you and then bring you home. There is a charge of 45p per mile for this service to cover the petrol and depreciation costs which I hope you find acceptable.

An extraordinary meeting of the Parish Council was held remotely on the 9th February via Zoom.

Present were chair John Hume, four councillors, clerk and two members of the public. Two councillors were absent.

Minutes of previous meeting were confirmed as correct.

Planning – progress:

Leys House: these two applications which had been discussed at a previous meeting have been withdrawn.

Application of Agricultural Determination, Bridges Farm.

Proposal: The application was to determine if prior approval is required for erection, extension or alteration of a building for agricultural use. The proposed building was for additional storage and would be adjacent to existing buildings. After consideration a unanimous decision was made to support this proposal and therefore determined prior approval was not necessary.

There was no other business.

Next meeting: 1st March 6.00 via Zoom.

NEWS FROM KERSEY SCHOOL

Otters (Reception, Year 1 and Year 2):

Otters class started the year with the book Wild by Emily Hughes.

We really enjoyed the illustrations and the story telling through the pictures. We got to explore different animals and habitats through the book and the story gave us lots of interesting ideas to discuss.

All the Otters have become Seesaw experts this half term and together we are finding creative ways to learn and respond on the online platform. Some of the best times this half term have been on live lessons and form time where we could all be together, seeing each other and having fun!

Badgers (Years 3 and 4):

Since Christmas our busy Badgers have designed and made model sleds to compete in the Race to the Top of the World. Our guides on this journey were two young children, Sika and Shen and their team of sixty-six pugs. Along the way we have met yetis, kraken and fifty different types of snow. What an adventure and what creative ideas for writing we have had. The recent weather conditions have enhanced our reading of the Pugs of the Frozen North and helped to inspire us.

Meanwhile, we have all worked hard in our phonics, English and maths lessons, enjoying live lessons on Zoom with our teachers and friends. This has been a great way to keep in touch and share our ideas. We have also used this technology to celebrate our successes in assembly and to catch up with each other in form time. Our computing skills are being applied every day.

Recently, we celebrated Children's Mental Health Week with some mindful activities to express ourselves. This was a wonderful experience and the children particularly enjoyed the art activity.

Owls (Years 5 and 6):

Owls have been working incredibly hard since our return to school after Christmas. They have been learning online, at home and at school, with an amazing resilience and motivation for doing their best; so much so, that at our weekly live celebration assemblies, Owls have been the class with the best attendance for 3 consecutive weeks of this term!

Owls have enjoyed weekly form time, which has enabled them to see their friends over Zoom – a much needed antidote to all of the time away from their classmates. Some of their English and Maths lessons have also been live, and other lessons have been shared on our online learning platform, Seesaw. The children get instant feedback and marking from their teachers, and they get to see their teachers in each day in their morning video messages.

Owls' topic this term has been on the Victorians, and their History and English lessons have been based on this. All other learning has taken place each day, alongside English and Maths, including RE, Art, Science, French and Computing. This has given Owls a real variety of learning, much like a 'usual' school day. Owls have also enjoyed daily collective worship, based on our worship theme (Courage).

Their PSHE and PE sessions have focused on their health and well-being, encouraging them to talk about their feelings and also to get moving!

FARMING NOTES

Arable:

Writing this on 21st of February coincided with the first day of what looks set to be at least ten days of fine and milder dry weather, which is a great relief for all. Our loyal staff have been working away at a couple of fairly extensive hedging and ditching jobs that some of you will have noticed. Drainage, and hence ditches are of great importance during wet spells as we have had recently. Some of the ditches do not have a great deal of 'fall' so care has to be taken to get the levels right and they need more regular cleaning than ones with more natural fall. We have taken delivery of a couple of hundred tons of fertiliser recently and are hoping to get a dressing on to the oil seed rape and some of the more backward cereals later this week, to kick start plant development during the warmer weather. This will comprise all of the Phosphate and Potash for the coming harvest and a small amount of nitrogen blended together as one application, along with a little sulphur in the form of SO3 which aids the plant's use of nitrogen as well as playing an important role in the production of chlorophyll that allows photosynthesis.

Now that the meadows are beginning to get a little drier I hope we will find time to do some fence maintenance. This involves taking heavy machinery on to the grass to replace some of the corner posts that have rotted at the base as well as replacing defective supporting posts and checking the wire. All of this will have to be put on hold when the good weather eventually allows us to start cultivations for spring drilling. This will be a pleasant fresh start after the difficult winter we have had.

Livestock:

Calving the main group of cows started at the beginning of February and to date about 20 calves have been born. Generally things have gone well but one calf was still born: despite having a strong heartbeat for several minutes after birth we were unable to get him to take his first breath. Although animal losses are part of livestock farming we do try very hard to avoid them and are always disappointed and saddened when they happen.

Last year's calf crop which were weaned and housed in October have spent the winter eating and growing, putting on well over one kilogram per day, and now, with the oldest at just over a year and weighing in excess of 500kg the first of them will be ready for market soon. Supplies of beef are tight and we hope the demand for our cattle will be strong when we start selling them. On the pedigree side two bulls went off to join the Cogent breeding stud in January and a further three are scheduled to go in March.

Lambing yards have been prepared and the ewes housed in preparation for lambing which is due to start in early March. We normally leave the ewes out until just before lambing, but with all the meadows waterlogged they have been housed early. As previously mentioned we bought and used a new Suffolk stock ram last year and we look forward to seeing what the new crop of lambs will be like. Bentley Zoom comes from a line which should produce easily born active lambs, this may help make lambing time a little easier and hopefully keep losses to a minimum.

BABERGH DISTRICT COUNCIL

Car Parking

Cabinet met on the 4th of February and resolved to approve the implementation of charges in Hadleigh, Sudbury and Pin Mill. The paper was debated in full by both the members of the cabinet and attending Councillors. The revised proposals were generally the same, but instead of 30 minutes free parking an hour's free parking was agreed. Also the original proposals were due to start in July, but this has now been pushed back and charges will begin no earlier than 1st October. This date will remain under review dependant on the situation with pandemic and the economy.

Amendments to the paper were accepted that will make 24-hour parking permits available to the residents in Mill Lane, Sudbury. Members of the cabinet also agreed that the strategy should ensure that a proportion of the income generated will be allocated to deliver sustainable travel. Although, the original proposals did allude to this, members agreed that it should be reinforced with a clear statement.

Residents will be unhappy with the decision and they will feel that it took little notice of their feelings, which were made clear in petitions in both Hadleigh and Sudbury. This despite the Hadleigh petition being backed by full Council in January. It is disappointing that these charges are not being implemented in conjunction with a wider travel strategy and I will continue to push that 100% of the profits, after maintenance and ongoing costs, are ringfenced to improve sustainable travel in the district.
