FARMING NOTES

Arable:

For the first time in a number of years the weather this autumn has allowed us to make excellent progress with the ploughing and other cultivations since harvest. The progress has been so good that by mid-October we had completed all the autumn sowing of OSR, wheat and barley and even managed to get the herbicide programme up to date in good conditions. This gets us off to a good start and sets us up well for the rest of the year. Thanks are also due to the diligent work of our loyal staff who have put in some serious hours during and since harvest.

On the downside, we are having to deal with huge input price increases across a whole range of products, not least fuel, feed and fertiliser. This morning I read a publication from our buying group that states that since early September our inputs have been subject to 22.5% inflation and rising. The worst example is urea nitrogen fertiliser that has leapt from circa £300 per ton to well over £700! I fear that this and other factors will result in a steep rise in general inflation and possibly higher interest rates.

Sheep:

The Suffolk ewes are currently split into 2 groups and are running with our two stock rams: one group of 34 are with Bentley Zoom, a ram which we bought last year; the others are with a home bred ram lamb (our best 2021 born lamb) which I have named Kersey Roooot (a reference to the calls which supporters make when the England cricket captain is scoring runs). Both rams are working well and have covered all of the ewes within the first 3 weeks.

Cattle:

Most of the cattle have now been housed for the winter and weaned, (the calves separated from the cows). In a change from normal this year at weaning, we kept the calves in yards next to the cows so that although unable to suckle, they could still nuzzle their mums and 'talk' through the gate. So far they seem to be less stressed, to be settling more quickly and making less noise. The mild open autumn and good late grass growth has made it possible for us to leave about 20 of the cows and heifers (which don't have calves at foot) out for a little longer which is nice as it takes the pressure off the yards while other cattle are sorted, handled and in some cases sold.

New building:

Jimmy and Lawrence recently spent several days putting in a drain for the new building at Bridges Farm. Because of the large volume of roof water which needs to get away quickly when it rains we felt that a new land drain 150mm wide and nearly 200 metres long was necessary. This involved digging a long deep trench all the way down to the nearest ditch. Despite appearances this was not done entirely by hand... our 8 tonne 360° digger also helped!

An extraordinary meeting of the Parish Council was held on the 11th October. Present were chairman, three councillors and clerk.

Apologies received from two councillors and one member of the public.

Minutes of September meeting were confirmed and signed as correct.

Planning: Progress – Land to the rear of 1-6 The Street. Discharge of Conditions. Condition 3 (Written scheme of Investigation) for SCC. Archaeological service has approved the written scheme for archaeological trenched evaluation and are happy for work to go ahead. The Old Vicarage. Babergh has approved felling of two trees.

Kersey Mill. Construction of workshop building, erection of garage and domestic outbuilding. Permission has been granted – Ayers End. Babergh has granted permission for erection of a greenhouse. Planning applications – Vale House. Erection of cart lodge with study, store and open garage. Parish councillors considered the proposal and agreed to support subject to it not becoming a separate residential dwelling in the future.

Consider nominating The Bell as an Asset of Community Value.

It was agreed that The Bell is at the heart of the Kersey community. Councillors agreed it was important to formally register it as an ACV so that if it is ever sold or changes proposed it can be protected for the community. It was agreed the Parish Council should submit an application to Babergh.

Proposed feedback to Screen Suffolk regarding recent filming.

Communication during the recent filming had been poor and the company had left signs behind. Some residents had not been informed on road closures and the need to move vehicles. It was agreed to provide feedback to Screen Suffolk so any future filming in Kersey could be better managed. To avoid filming on a Thursday which is bin day and co-ordinate with The Bell better so business is less disrupted.

AOB: A councillor (Pascoe Gibbons) has resigned. They are awaiting confirmation from Babergh this position can be filled by co-option.Vacancy will be advertised. **Next meeting** 15th November.

The Parish Council continues to work with Groundwork East and the Suffolk Climate Change Partnership to help Kersey residents reduce their carbon footprint. Hopefully you have all had time to complete the survey, as mentioned in the September newsletter.

BABERGH DISTRICT COUNCIL

Corks Lane

The redevelopment of the old Council offices in Hadleigh has been delayed due to an ongoing dispute with the Cricket club. This issue has now been resolved and it is hoped that the redevelopment can begin in the next few months. However before the work begins there are still some non-material amendments to the planning consent that are in hand with the planning team. Some of the buildings are listed and work on these also still need listed building consent and Local Planning Authority approval. The Council are also awaiting tenders from contractors, but the deadline for this has been extended to allow for the effects of Brexit and Covid on the construction industry.

Council commits to reducing light emitted

The Council have committed to reducing streetlight intensity across their districts – protecting plant and wildlife, and reducing energy use, in line with biodiversity and climate change ambitions. This will include additional lighting control guidance within their Biodiversity Supplementary Planning Document (SPD), currently in development, was also approved.

The move provides an opportunity for the councils to reduce their energy use, as well as the negative impacts on human wellbeing, and wildlife, caused by intense blue-white light. A particular focus has been placed on protecting and enhancing dark skies for bats, owls and other nocturnal insect populations which are declining.

iPad Lending Scheme

Suffolk Libraries and Babergh and Mid Suffolk District Councils are joining forces to help residents get online with a new iPad lending scheme. Twenty-Six new iPads, all with 4G internet connectivity and a range of pre-installed applications and web links, will be available for free to anyone in the two districts to borrow. They will be based at Stowmarket, Hadleigh, Sudbury and Needham Market libraries.

The pilot, which will last for a year will be available from participating libraries from 19 October. Anyone wishing to borrow one simply needs to have a Suffolk Libraries account and sign up to the user agreement. The iPads can be borrowed for up to three weeks, and as they already have inbuilt mobile internet, residents can get online even if they don't have an internet connection at home.
