#### **VOLUNTEERS NEEDED**

There would be no obligation to help with CPR or any other emergency treatment, it would be up to each volunteer as to how much they help. Full CPR, basic life support and defibrillator training will be offered from the Community Heartbeat Trust. ## BABERGH DISTRICT COUNCIL

#### **Housing matters**

Babergh have adopted an updated Tenancy Policy. Our tenants need the security of a clear understanding of their tenancy so they can plan for their futures, and we can make the best use of our limited supply of homes. Secure tenancies and good management ensure this.

The Council have obtained a share of £20,000 funding from the Local Government Association for a county wide housing strategy review. Not a lot, truth be told. However, there are properties everywhere that are available for rent or purchase, long-term empty, or second homes. In total, in Suffolk they number around 13,000. Despite this, we have people in unsatisfactory, unsuitable, accommodation and the facing threat, or reality, of homelessness. All the Councils seek to address this by working together to increase access to genuinely affordable property.

#### **Devolution Deal**

The deal, which is still being developed, devolves more powers to Suffolk, bringing around £480 million of investment over the next 30 years. The intention is to drive growth in the county. It will include £5.8 million to regenerate brownfield land into affordable homes; devolvement of the adult education budget to meet local needs; additional transport powers; and £3million to improve energy efficiency in homes. It also includes provisions to directly elect the leader of Suffolk County Council, the election of which would take place in 2024.

#### **Future Fees & Charges**

Fees and Charges for a range of services will increase in 2023/24. Many, and the important ones really, are set nationally and deal with licensing and building control amongst other statutory areas.

The biggest change most people are likely to notice is a £2 increase (to £59.pa) to the Garden waste collection charge. It's been a very popular service for people who have gardens, attracting new subscribers every year. New subscribers will have a one-off charge of £69 for the first year for the cost of the brown bin. These fees and charges will bring in over £4m, about 11% of the gross expenditure.

## PARISH COUNCIL

A Parish Council meeting was held on the 30th January.

In attendance was John Hume, chair, three councillors, District councillor and the clerk.

**Apologies** received from two councillors and County councillor.

**Co-option:** There was still a vacancy for a councillor.

**Public forum and reports:** Robert Lindsay County Councillor reported that there is a backlog of flooding and drainage problems. Money which had been allocated for these is being spent elsewhere. Also reported was an update on the budget and the Directly Elected Leader.

Leigh Jamieson District Councillor said he is providing some money from his locality budget to the Village Hall projects which are planned. Also in his report was the second part of the Wolsey Grange development in Ipswich which has been approved, Housing matters and Solar Panel Carports. No decision has been taken on the proposed Solar Farm between Elmsett and Flowton.

The budget for 23/24 is being prepared. There will be a small increase in the cost of brown bin collections. Babergh has compiled a report of achievements made since 2019.

**Parish time:** The current editor of the newsletter is stepping down.

Minutes of the previous meetings were correct and signed.

**Clerk's report:** The clerk regularly checks the defibrillator and sends reports to the Community Heartbeat Trust. Several surveys have been completed. The street lighting was converted to LED units in September. The correct black units have now been fitted. New "No dog fouling" signs have been produced and given to the footpath working group to display. There is a possibility of an email update circular for residents. If there is enough interest this would be set up independently of the Parish Council. The Kersey website is regularly updated.

All correspondence had been circulated to councillors. One noted was Headway Suffolk mobile charity shop. A mobile shop is being considered to sell goods, refreshments and give advice on neurological problems and how to access services. They are thinking of visiting parishes on a regular basis. Councillors discussed this but felt this was not a viable option with only 350 residents. A stop in Hadleigh with more footfall would be a better option.

**Finance:** The council resolved to adopt the new pay scale for the clerk. A copy of the financial statements had been circulated to all councillors for approval. All payments were approved.

**Planning progress:** Babergh had granted permission for retention of dormer extension at Bramble cottage. They had also given consent for works to oak tree in Vale Lane. This is protected by Tree Preservation Order.

Planning applications to be considered at next meeting. Erection of single storey extension at Manor Farm.

**Footpath Working Group:** The footpaths in and around Kersey are fully operational. There has been a number of reports to SCC from members of the public regarding posts

and signage. These appear to have been dealt with. All machinery has been serviced ready for the new cutting season. The budget was approved.

**KCPC Working Group:** The ROSPA report had been received without too many maintenance recommendations. These points will be dealt with as necessary. The hedges have been cut. The budget was approved.

Consider progress on whether Kersey should have a Village Emergency Telephone System. It had been agreed at an earlier meeting if enough volunteers living near The Bell came forward there would be further investigation into the system. At least ten volunteers are needed. Training would be given on how to use the defibrillator, CPR and basic life support skills.

Consider progress on the Parish Review and creating a public consultation questionnaire. Little progress has been made.

Consider whether the Parish Council will report planning control non-compliance issues. The Parish Council have been made aware of a few possible planning control issues in the parish. It was agreed the council will if necessary make Babergh aware of any concerns. Babergh to be notified of concerns that alterations have been made to the Grade II listed Curtis Farm without consent.

Consider a Coronation celebration for Kersey. It was agreed it would be good to bring the community together for an event. A celebration could be on Sunday 7th. After the jubilee celebrations last year it was thought a smaller event would be more appropriate with possibly a picnic on The Glebe.

Spring litter collection. Members of the Kersey Volunteer Group already cover most of the parish carrying out regular litter collections and reporting any highway issues. They will be thanked for their work during the year and reminded that March is "Spring Clean" month. More volunteers are needed to join the KVG. The school will be contacted to see if they will tidy near the school.

Confirm precept. This was set at £11,520.

Agree content for "Pride in our Parish". It was agreed to write an article explaining the possible Volunteer Emergency Telephone System and ask for volunteers.

**Training:** SALC continues to offer online training. The clerk will be attending a Networking session and election briefing. There will be Parish Council elections in the Babergh area on 4th May.

**Dates** of forthcoming meetings were given.

**AOB:** The chickens at The Bell have been captured and re-homed. Due to a car blocking access for the bin lorry households in The Green had their collection delayed. Road cones will be used to try and stop this in the future. A concern was raised about speeding through the village and splash.

**Next meeting** 6th March.

## **FARMING NOTES**

#### Arable

Midway through February during the dry conditions, just as we were about to start some spring work on the land, we were shocked to learn that our staff member Ryan sustained a badly broken leg while playing rugby for Sudbury firsts. This leaves us short staffed for the busy period ahead and I would like to thank Lawrence and Sarah for stepping up to help out. Lawrence and I have managed to fathom out the rather complicated electronics on our brand new fertiliser spreader that Ryan was due to start using the day after the accident, and are making good progress with the potash, magnesium and sulphur mix that we have to apply to all the land this spring. Sarah is helping out more with the livestock where Ryan would normally help Chris for an hour or so on Monday, Wednesday and Friday mornings. So far things are going to plan but we could easily fall behind in the next 2 months, and as timeliness is key in farming, we must not let this happen. We all wish Ryan a speedy and comfortable recovery.

#### Livestock

Ditto Rob's comments about Ryan. We all know rugby is a physical game with a high risk of injury, but we have supported Ryan's career and followed his progress with interest. This was a nasty injury and a big setback for him.

Meanwhile calving has continued with so far very good results. Commercial crossbred calves are due to be born any time throughout March and April. We also have batches of Pedigree British Blue calves due to be born during the year. The first of which are due this week, the result of embryos transferred to surrogate mums nine months ago. The first four calves have arrived and we are closely watching the remaining two cows for any signs of action.

Lambing is due to begin in early March so we have some busy weeks ahead. The ewes were pregnancy scanned a few weeks ago and just four out of sixty were not in lamb. Due to the pleasant and dry outdoor conditions it is hoped to be able to leave them out until just before lambing starts.

In the autumn we replaced the Merlo telescopic loader, which we use almost every day throughout the year. The new one, which is the same make, has an extra boom section and a more powerful (150 horse power) engine. So far we are very pleased with it; the extra reach is proving very useful for many of the jobs we do. During the year we use it to load and draw home



about 1300 large bales of straw, 300 bales of silage and 3000 small straw bales. The machine is also used to unload all of that at the farm as well as other deliveries. All the yards are mucked out on a regular basis with the FYM being stored in a large heap at the farm, in the autumn all of that is loaded again for spreading onto the arable fields. During the winter we use the Merlo daily for feeding malt nuts, fodder beet and silage to the cattle and three times a week we straw all of the yards. It's also really good at being a long barrier when moving cattle (see photo). Clearly it is a machine we cannot manage without!

## SOUTH SUFFOLK CONSTITUENCY

Recent years have been some of the most challenging to be in Government, with a pandemic followed immediately by war and an unprecedented surge in energy prices – and therefore the cost of living. So, it is a source of solace and strength to be able to get out into the beautiful villages and countryside of South Suffolk, and it is always a particular delight to come to Kersey.

On the 20th January I met the headteacher and staff at Kersey Primary School, including a session of brilliant and interesting questions from the pupils. Small rural primaries are a special part of our county's culture, but inevitably – like all schools – have their particular challenges. At my previous visit I agreed to return once the school had academised, and it was pleasing to hear the positive impact that this step has had, and also to learn of the school's plans for its 150 year anniversary. I was also pleased to see the newly installed school signs which I was glad to facilitate through Suffolk County Council.

Just before Christmas I visited award winning Soaps 'n' Scrubs based at Kersey Mill, and my wife was very pleased with her unique Advent calendar purchased from the shop – consisting of a different bathing delight for each day of the 25. But it's vital that we all do our bit to shop local all year round, not just at Christmas, and especially in the current global economic context which in many ways has been toughest for the smallest high street businesses.

On that point, I cannot stress enough that I do understand how difficult it has been in recent months, having to cope with such extraordinary increases in the price of daily items, especially energy and food. As a Treasury Minister I've been proud of the amount of support that we have put in place, in recognition of the exceptional nature of the post-Ukraine invasion surge in living costs. All this said, there remains much to be positive about. At my Jobs Fair in Hadleigh in February there were literally thousands of vacancies on offer, from engineering firms and household name employers to small businesses, to the public sector e.g., Army, NHS, and Police. Looking forward, it is clear that our locality's ability to attract visitors to its pubs and shops will be important – and so I hoped it helped Kersey to feature in the 'Magpie Murders' series, which Emily and I very much enjoyed.
